Pet owners reminded to respect 'no dogs allowed' signage

The City of Edmonton reminds pet owners that not all public spaces are dog-friendly. Within the city, dogs are not permitted within 10 metres of school grounds, sport fields, playgrounds, picnic sites and golf courses. ([Parkland Bylaw C2202](#))

While these spaces are off-limits, there are still plenty of places in Edmonton where dogs ARE allowed! Pet owners can take their dogs on trails and boulevards, and to other areas with signage permitting dogs, as long as they are on-leash. In a public space, you are required to:

- control your dog;
- have a clear sight-line of your dog at all times; and
- pick up after your dog.

Want to let your dog run loose? There are [40 off-leash sites](#) in green spaces throughout the city where your dog can get the physical and emotional benefits that come from running and playing!


